Kristy qualified as a nurse in 2005, and has been working in palliative and end of life care for the last 7 years. Kristy discovered a passion for offering choice, delivering holistic care and enabling high quality palliative and end of life care acknowledging the difference it can make to patients and families, whilst working in a small community hospital.

She then developed this further by working as a Practice Facilitator across Leicestershire, County and Rutland providing education and training about end of life care to health and social care staff working across a variety of settings, and worked closely with colleagues from Leicestershire Hospice@Home service.

Kristy currently works as Lead Nurse for Specialist Palliative and End of Life Care, Bereavement and Mortuary Services at a District General hospital in Warwickshire North, working closely with colleagues from local hospices, and the Hospice@Home service at Mary Ann Evans Hospice. This role has grown over the last 3 years, and has allowed; expanded appreciation of national and local health and social care agenda; the innovation of events such as the highly successful Good Death Café; and service development creating unique roles such as a Macmillan Palliative Care Clinical Nurse Specialist working exclusively on an Acute Medical Unit, and a Macmillan Palliative Care Psychologist.

Kristy is embarking on a new adventure and has recently been appointed as Deputy Director of Nursing for Myton Hospices.
