I am a Registered General Nurse of 22 years, with a drive to ensure that patients receive high quality, evidence based care. 16 of those years was spent working in the community setting as a Community Staff Nurse and a District Nurse, with a little bit of time spent in Intermediate Care Nursing and Diabetes Specialist Nursing.

Since January 2015, I have worked for a Clinical Commissioning Group as an End of Life Care Commissioner. My job summary includes –

- Leading on the development of health services for patients at the end of their lives and/or in receipt of palliative care.
- Providing the advice needed in end of life and palliative care making recommendations for future commissioning.
- Overseeing the change management process required to support the implementation, integration and sustainability of the local end of life care strategy and the local commissioning strategy.
- Working collaboratively with stakeholders in achieving quality end of life care in the area.
